Zines (from 'fanzine' or 'magazine') are mostly short, self-created, self-published little books. They often have themes, include collage, and writing, and they can be highly collaborative. In their origins they were traditional media, made by hand, delivered through mail or in person. In their current iterations many of them are online or multimedia publications. They cover topics from computer science and queer advice to fermentation and preservation. Zines can be about most anything the heart desires.

In the Grad Library we came up with an idea to create a collaborative zine about the FIMS community pandemic experience. There's been lots of work done around archiving this "unprecedented time" and we thought it could be interesting and useful to have a zine which captured the more personal felt experiences of these years. The theme was textures: sensorial, emotional, mental, the embodiment and feeling of living through these years. The participants approached the theme from diverse perspectives and created pages which captured their own internal sense of this shared time.






























